WYOMING INNOVATION PARTNERSHIP

The Wyoming Innovation Partnership (WIP), initiated by Governor Mark Gordon in 2021, aims to modernize and enhance Wyoming's economic development efforts by fostering collaboration among state entities and local partners. This partnership includes the University of Wyoming, the state's community colleges, the Wyoming Business Council, the Wyoming Department of Workforce Services, and the Wyoming Department of Education. Its primary goal is to develop innovative solutions that bolster Wyoming's economy, workforce, and revenue sources through key objectives like workforce development, entrepreneurship support, business recruitment, business retention and expansion, research and innovation, and public-private partnerships. WIP FOCUSES ON AG

- The Ranch Management and Agriculture Leadership (RMAL) program aims to enhance collaboration with community colleges through a Bachelor of Science Degree, an internship program, and credentialed seminars.
- The Precision Agriculture initiative focuses on research, workforce training, education, and outreach to promote precision farming techniques.
- The Center for Controlled Environment Agriculture seeks to support the industry by conducting interdisciplinary research and developing modular farming chambers to supply fresh food to rural areas, fostering innovation in the field.

STARTUP SUPPORT

Wyoming offers various programs to support startups, including those in the ag-tech sector.

WYOMING SBIR GRANT PROGRAM

The program supports companies and helps advance groundbreaking technologies that have received Phase I or Phase II federal funding through the Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) or the Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) programs. Visit wbc.pub/SBIR_Match.

KICKSTART GRANT PROGRAM

KickStart is designed to support growth-oriented startups within the state to overcome initial hurdles through funding, mentorship, and future growth opportunities, and help launch businesses into the next phase of growth. Visit wbc.pub/Kickstart.

WYOMING VENTURE CAPITAL FUND (WYVC)

The WYVC is the quasi-governmental equivalent of a standard venture capital fund with a geographic focus. The fund utilizes investment strategies to support the growth of Wyoming entrepreneurs and startups. Visit wbc.pub/WYVC.

ASCEND ENGINE

The ASCEND Engine, supported by the **U.S. National Science Foundation** (NSF) and led by **Innosphere Ventures**, is driving a startup support program in Wyoming and Colorado. Focused on advanced sensing and computation for environmental decision-making, the initiative aims to create technologies that strengthen community resilience against natural disasters. EXPORT ASSISTANCE

ASIA PACIFIC MARKET

The Wyoming Asia Pacific Trade Office connects Wyoming producers with food buyers across the Asia Pacific region, leading to the sale of Wyoming beef, distilled spirits, beer, and cereal products in Taiwan.

INTERNATIONAL MARKETS

Wyoming also collaborates with the Western U.S. Agricultural Trade Association (WUSATA), a nonprofit supporting 15 western state agriculture departments, bringing European buyers to the U.S. and organizes trade events to expand international market access.
