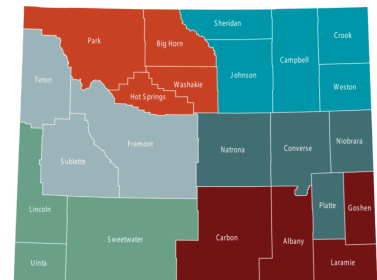

PROTECTING WYOMING'S ECONOMIC FUTURE

The Wyoming Business Council is proud of the ongoing regional successes shown in this report. Still, it is essential to acknowledge the risks our communities would face without this strategic support and **boots-on-the-ground leadership**.

Without the WBC's programs and services, the path to a diversified economy would face four critical barriers:

1. **Stalled Infrastructure:** Without the **BRC program**, major projects like the Southwest Wyoming Airport modernization, Lincoln County Sewer Project, or the Sheridan High-Tech Park would likely fail. Local tax bases cannot independently fund the infrastructure needed to **compete for industry and jobs** against neighboring states.
2. **Innovation Brain Drain:** Without **Kickstart, SBIR, and WYVC** funding, Wyoming's high-tech firms would be forced to seek capital outside the state. These programs are vital to ensuring our innovators keep their **jobs, intellectual property, and tax revenue** right here in Wyoming.
3. **Fragmented Local Leadership:** Without our **Regional Directors**, the essential link between state strategy and local action would be severed. Small-town administrations would lack the **coaching, strategic support, and know-how** needed to overcome local barriers to growth and secure complex funding opportunities.
4. **Vulnerable Small Businesses:** Without the collaborative reach of the **SBDC, WWBC, and Manufacturing Works**, thousands of local businesses would lose the technical expertise required to modernize, scale, and compete in a rapidly changing global market.

THE MOMENTUM FOR RESILIENCE

The Wyoming Business Council is more than a source of grants; **we are the momentum** required to keep Wyoming competitive.

Without this proactive, regionally focused engagement, our communities risk losing the infrastructure, local capacity, and business diversity needed to move beyond the traditional boom-and-bust cycle. We look forward to continuing our partnership with the Legislature to secure a resilient economic future for every corner of the state.
